Roles and responsibilities:

The Treasurer takes the lead at board level on:

- making sure the charity keeps proper accounts
- reviewing the charity's financial performance
- drawing up or reviewing policies for finance and investment
- ensuring that the charity has robust and effective financial controls in place
- liaising with finance staff and with the charity's independent examiner or auditor
- reporting on financial matters

The Treasurer will be required to attend full Board meetings and Finance Committee meetings, both held on Tuesday afternoons at the offices of Music and the Deaf in Halifax on a monthly basis. We are willing to consider outstanding applicants who are able to Skype or conference call if it is not possible for them to attend the meetings in person.
